The University of Cambridge's 13th-century founding was largely inspired by an association of scholars then who fled the University of Oxford for Cambridge following the *suspendium clericorium* (hanging of the scholars) in a dispute with local townspeople.

Oxford University and Cambridge University require students to apply to a particular major or course, which they are interested in, and which cannot be changed.

For the most popular courses, students are also required to sit an admissions test. The University of Oxford is located in Oxford City, on The Thames River, 80 km northwest of London. The University of Cambridge is located in Cambridge, England.

In contrast to Cambridge University, Oxford University is a private university, but it is regarded a national institution.

Like Cambridge, the academic year in Oxford is subdivided into three terms called Michaelmas (October to December; Hilary, January to March; and Trinity Term - April to June).

As far as we can tell, many elements in the history of these two universities are similar: ancient history, they are both located in prestigious areas, impeccable reputation, many educational opportunities that they provide to their students, the same division of the academic year. Both universities are prestigious, elite and authoritative.
